EXHIBITION THEME / RATIONALE

Culture Through Our Eyes is a First Nations Youth Exhibition that provides young First Nations creators with the opportunity to showcase their work in a professional gallery setting. Students are encouraged to create work that reflects how they see and experience their Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture — through their own eyes. The completed projects will be exhibited at the UMI Arts Gallery in Manooora until the end of February 2028. As the peak body representing the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander arts community across Far North Queensland — from the Torres Strait Islands to Cardwell, and west to Camooweal, the Gulf and Mt Isa regions — UMI Arts provides a strong cultural platform for emerging voices. All participating students, along with their parents, teachers, friends, and extended family, are warmly invited to the exhibition opening, a special occasion to celebrate the creativity, talent, and achievements of these young artists. This opportunity is open to First Nations students enrolled in Years 7–12 in Cairns and surrounding areas who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and have a recognised bloodline connection to the community.

Works in any medium are accepted.

ABOUT UMI ARTS

UMI Arts is the lead Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander arts and cultural organisation for Far North Queensland, and a not-for-profit company managed by an all-Indigenous Board of Directors. UMI Arts represents the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander arts community of Far North Queensland within the Torres Strait Islands, south to Cardwell, west to Camooweal and the Gulf and Mt Isa regions. UMI Arts is a signatory to the Australian Indigenous Art Code that preserves and promotes ethical trading in Indigenous Art. UMI Arts was established in 2005, and its mission is to operate an Indigenous organisation that assists Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to participate in the maintenance, preservation and protection of cultural identity. UMI is a Creole word meaning 'You and Me' – UMI Arts' goal is to strengthen Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural practices, including visual arts and crafts, dance, ceremony, storytelling, and music.

PROJECT BRIEF FOR STUDENTS

Plan and create an artwork that expresses how you see your Culture - through your own eyes. This project invites you to share your identity, stories, and connections to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture in your own creative way.

Things to think about:

- How does your culture influence who you are today?
- How do you keep culture strong in your life and community?
- What story, knowledge, or experience would you like to share?
- How do you see the world around you?
- What is important to you, your family, or your community?

Use this theme as a starting point and explore your own ideas, symbols, and creative style.

Sketching ideas first is encouraged.

When your artwork is complete, write your **Artwork Story** and **Artist Biography**, and submit all materials to your **First Nations Officer, Art Teacher, or Program Coordinator**.

EXPRESSION OF INTEREST – TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Culture Through Our Eyes – First Nations Youth Exhibition

This exhibition is open to First Nations students in Years 7–12 from selected schools and youth programs.

- Students must create their own original artwork
- Artwork should be recently made
- Work must be respectful and culturally appropriate
- Cultural stories, symbols, and language must be approved where required
- Not all artworks may be selected
- No fee is required

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The student agrees to:

- Complete all forms
- Meet deadlines
- Provide safe, exhibition-ready artwork
- Follow teacher instructions
- Ensure spelling and cultural information is correct
- Participate in exhibition activities where possible, eg, Media Call and Launch
- Parent / Guardian permission is required for all students under 18.

UMI ARTS RESPONSIBILITIES

UMI Arts will:

- Exhibit selected artworks
- Care for artworks during exhibition
- Photograph works for promotion
- Credit the artist
- Organise installation and opening event
- Return artworks after the exhibition

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Your application must include:

- Application checklist
- Parent consent form
- Media release
- Artist biography
- Artist statement/artwork story
- Image of artwork
- Student name on all forms
- Submit to your teacher or First Nations Officer.

Send all documents to your Art Teacher or First Nations Officer.

The school Art Teacher will submit the completed applications to UMI Arts.

SALES & PAYMENT

Artworks in the **Culture Through Our Eyes** exhibition can be available for sale. If an artwork is sold, UMI Arts will add its **30% commission** to the artist's price.

As part of UMI Arts' policy, payment of sales is processed into your nominated bank account at the end of the month of sale.
